
Handing out Candy on Halloween!







Monthly recreation calendars will be available at the front desk when the current outbreak is over. Until then, keep an eye on the elevators and lobby for weekly recreation calendars. Extra copies will be available at the front desk.

During outbreak the following changes are made to programs:

- Masking is strongly recommended in all common areas
- Social distancing of 6 feet is required, and no sharing of items in programs cards, board games and live entertainment cancelled, exercise and bingo modified to accommodate social distancing
- No eating or drinking in programs cocktail social cancelled
- The van is only to be used for medical transportation, and only one resident in the van at a time shopping and community outings cancelled, during medical transportation priority will be given to those getting to appointments on time, you may have to wait longer than usual for pick up
- No cardio exercises or singing in programs hymn sing/sing along cancelled, exercises modified to exclude cardio
- Externally run programs are notified of the outbreak and given a choice to cancel if they are not comfortable coming in some presentations, church services, in house shopping events etc. may be cancelled at the discretion of the service provider
- Tuck Shop is closed for the duration of the outbreak. Call 8155 to discuss pick-up options for essential tuck items.
